Terms of Entry

By entering this tournament, you agree to all the terms below along with the **Boland Golf Union General Terms of**Competition, Code of Conduct and the GolfRSA Logo and Marks Policy.

Ceres Junior Open

- o The Tournament will be played at Ceres GC on 26 January 2025.
- o <u>Tournament Format</u>: Stroke Play of which competitors will play 18 holes

Eligibility

The tournament is open to any male and female amateur golfer, who must be a member of a club affiliated with a Golf Union or another similar International Body recognised by GolfRSA. On entry, players must have a valid Handicap Index of 32,0 or less.

Divisions

Championship Division

o U/19 Boys/Girls (H. I. of 6.5 or less): to play Stroke Play (medal) from the Club tees.

Silver Division

o U/19 Boys/Girls (H. I. 6.6 to 15,3): to play Stroke Play (medal) from the Club or Forward tees.

Gold Division

o U/13 Boys and Girls (H. I. of 15,3 or less): to play Stroke Play (medal) from the Forward tees.

Bronze Division

o All Junior Golfers (H. I. of 15,4 or more): to play Stroke Play (Nett Double Bogey Rule)

U/19 Boys – Club tees | U/13 Boys & U/19 Girls – Forward tees

Prizes:

- o Championship Division (overall U/19 including the U/15s & U/17s)
 - Two separate divisions for Boys and Girls (different courses if applicable)
- o Silver Division (U/13 Boys & Girls)
 - One division for boys and girls due to playing the same course (forward tees)
- Bronze Division

All junior golfers (H. I. of 15,4 or more) in one division and not limited to a course.

Prizes will be awarded in all sections subject to the number of participants in each division. The top 3 positions will be awarded prizes, there must be a minimum of 5 players in a category for a prize to be awarded.

- o Additional prizes are at the discretion of the club when contributing towards the prizes.
- Prize winners are required to be present for the prize claim; otherwise, they will forfeit their winnings.
 Unclaimed prizes will be transferred to the next position, and players will maintain their ranking without receiving a prize.

If a tie for first place occurs in stroke play divisions, the tournament committee will organize a playoff, considering the available time and daylight. Prizes for other tied positions will be decided using a count-out procedure, starting with the last 9 holes, then the last 6 holes, and finally the last 3 holes. If the tie persists, the winner will be determined by the result on the lowest stroke hole.

BGU reserve the right to refuse a player's entry if the player has score abnormalities, such as more than two (2) penalty scores, on Handicap Network Africa (HNA), refer to the General Terms of Competition.

A player's handicap will be updated on the first day of the tournament

Field Size and Draws

- O Course Capacity, Allocated Tee Times, and the Number of Entrants will determine the Tournament Field Size. Should more than the stipulated entries be received, entries will be reduced by the Tournament Organizing Committee by giving preference to the lower H.I. players. Participants who do not make it to the final draw will receive a refund based on the applicable terms.
- o The draw will be available on www.bolandgolf.co.za and players are responsible for ensuring they obtain their tee time.
- The Draw will be based on age categories (Mid-Amateur, Seniors, Open and Juniors)

Entry Process

- o Entry fee is R120.00 (includes VAT)
- o The entry fee includes the green fees, and prizes and excludes food and beverage.
- o All entries must be submitted online at www.bolandgolf.co.za.
- o The entry fee will be payable in full at the time of entry.
- o All information required must be provided accurately and in full.

The Entrant's Declaration, on the online Entry Form, must be ticked as acceptance of declaration. By doing so the player also acknowledges the Terms of Entry along with the Boland Golf Union General Terms of Competition and the GolfRSA Logo and Marks Policy.

Late Entry Process

- o Players wanting to enter the tournament after the closing date must email office@bolandgolf.co.za requesting to enter the tournament and will be placed on a waiting list.
- o If spots are available based on a 3-ball or 4-ball draw, the first late entry received will be invited to participate.
- o Players on the waiting list due to the field being oversubscribed will be given first preference over the late entry waiting list.

Caddies, Golf Carts & Spectators

Caddies: No player (including U/13 players) is allowed to make use of a caddie.

A player must not have another player in the competition as their caddie during the round. Model Local Rule H-1.2

<u>Golf Carts</u>: Players wishing to use a motorised cart must submit a date-relevant doctor's note to <u>office@bolandgolf.co.za</u> before the entry closing date. Requests to use a cart will only be granted to <u>players with a disability or a long-term degenerative medical condition</u> as per the GolfRSA Transportation Policy which can be viewed <u>here</u>. The tournament committee will grant or deny approval based on the Rules of Golf.

<u>Spectators</u>: Spectators must keep off the tees, fairways, and greens and avoid interfering with any player. Cell phones should be switched off, as audible emissions are not acceptable. The use of motorised golf carts by spectators is not allowed. Failure to comply with these rules may result in spectators being asked to leave the golf course.

- Player & Marker Scoring Responsibility
- Throughout the round, the player is responsible for maintaining their scores for each hole, as outlined in Rule 3.3b(2).
- o Following the round, the player must verify the hole-by-hole score with their marker and verbally present the scores to the tournament official at the designated scoring area.

Prizegiving & Tied Positions

If a tie for first place occurs in both divisions, the tournament committee will organise a playoff, considering the available time and daylight. Prizes for other tied positions will be shared.

No age category prizes will be awarded to winners within individual age groups or divisions. Instead, prizes will be allocated based on gross and nett scores to promote fair competition among all participants. Additional prizes are at the discretion of the club when contributing towards the prizes.

Withdrawals and Non-Arrivals
